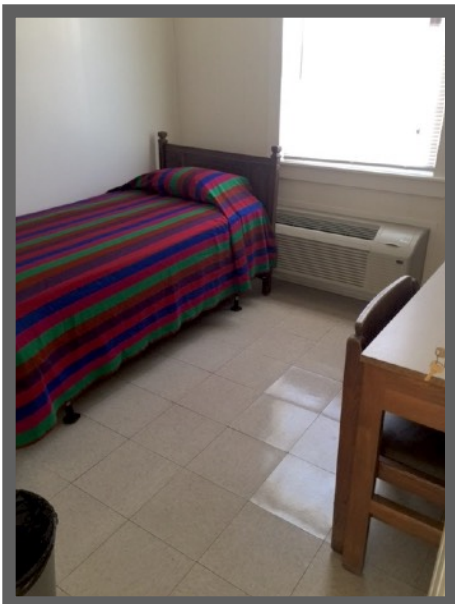


Housing Available

Housing is available for students taking programs at the SVCC Occupational/Technical Center. Individual bedrooms with a single bed, sheets, chest-of-drawers, closet and locking doors with shared kitchen, bath, washer and dryer, common room and computers plus Internet are included. Truck Driver Training Program

If you are looking for a new and rewarding career where the income, benefits and job security are excellent, the Truck Driver Training School at Southside Virginia Community College has just the seat for you--the driver's seat. Trucking companies are growing their fleets and hiring drivers as trucking continues to move the American economy.

Full time entry-level drivers can expect to earn \$35,000 to \$45,000 plus benefits during their first year of employment. After successful completion of the six-week training program, drivers will have their Commercial Driver's License (CDL) and the skills needed for a new career.

Diesel Technician Training Program

This 2 semester, state-of-the-art program, certified by NATEF offers training in air brakes, diesel engines, electrical/electronics, preventive maintenance, steering and suspension systems.

The training center at SVCC uses computer-operated software, training on electric/electronic simulators, and applies all of this training to hands-on mode in a modern, well-equipped 8,000 square-foot shop.

Growth in transportation and construction industries are generating an increased need for skilled diesel repair technicians nationwide. A skilled entry-level tech can expect to earn a salary of \$30,000 to \$40,000 annually depending on location.



Power Line Worker Training

This 11-week course, using curriculum from the National Center for Construction Education and Research, addresses fundamental aspects of power line work to ensure safety for both the public and electrical crews. Electrical line workers install, remove, maintain, and repair high-voltage and low-voltage distribution lines and associated equipment and facilities. Training includes: safety, electrical theory, climbing techniques, aerial framing, rigging, operating utility service equipment and Commercial Driver's License (CDL). Prospective students should be aware that this is a physically demanding training program requiring climbing, outdoor activities in all weather conditions, and some heavy lifting.
