Your Help is Needed!

Each employee and student can contribute to a safer and more crime-free campus.

Access to a cell phone or other means of communication provides you with the unique opportunity to improve the quality of life on campus.

Your awareness and reporting of suspicious or emergency situations to SVCC staff can help prevent and/or solve crimes, provide emergency assistance which may save a life, and will help deter criminal activity through the implantation of crime prevention procedures and high visibility.



OBSERVE AND REPORT

Accidents: Vehicles, people, animals.

Fires: Buildings, auto, grass, trash.

Safety Hazards: Faulty lighting, broken doors, window locks, blocked halls, windows or doors, etc.

Suspicious Circumstances: Strange persons or events, unusual or untimely behavior or conditions of any kind, suspicious vehicles, when taking night classes walk to the parking lot in pairs or groups.

If In Doubt: Contact SVCC Campus Security or the receptionist immediately. Describe the location and situation as completely as possible.

REPORTING INSTRUCTIONS

Observe the situation and notify SVCC receptionist or security as soon as possible. Advise of the location and if danger or physical harm is threatened or exists. **The receptionist will send security immediately.**

Describe the situation and exact location as accurately as possible, i.e., "A tall white male lurking around", record make of vehicle, license, distinguishing features/clothing, description of suspects.
